4. Speaker Request:

a. Shannon Oltmann reached out to us to do a program on book banning. The program is scheduled for February 15th, 2024. Her fee is \$500. The process to

apply for mini-grants is not completely finalized yet, and once it is, requests will be reviewed on a quarterly basis.

- b. Program Description: Book bans are sharply on the rise across the U.S., and New Jersey is no different. In this talk, we'll discuss how to respond to concerned citizens and patrons, how to deal with book challenges in your community, and how to support librarians facing challenges. We'll cover "request for reconsideration" forms and strategies for success, using real world examples. We anticipate this webinar will help prepare you for possible book challenges and bans, as well as increasing your abilities to handle disgruntled patrons. This will be relevant to public, school, and academic librarians across the state.

- (From Eric): The board approved the 2024 salary guide on Nov. 21. It's effective Jan. 1 and calls for a 4% across-the-board increase, except for the Page position, which is a 7.077% increase to meet New Jersey's 2024 minimum wage of \$15.13 per hour.
- Ralph Bingham announced in their last meeting that LibraryLinkNJ will be joining the Professional Development Alliance.
 - According to Eric, they are a group that shares Professional Development events (mostly academic?) and are related to the International Coalition of Library Consortia (https://icolc.net/).
 - From Eric's e-mail: Basically, LLNJ will share its own PD programs and post PD programs from the other partners in the Professional Development Alliance.

- a. (Eric) The Personnel Administration Subcommittee will propose a conference session on labor unions in libraries (something like "unions 101"), with speakers from libraries with labor unions. We are inviting representatives of several library worker unions to speak about the benefits -- and costs -- of organizing, joining, participating in, understanding, and taking full advantage of a union. Every library is different, and some libraries have a union, some libraries are Civil Service, and some are neither unionized nor Civil Service. They may also be libraries that are both unionized and involved in Civil Service.

(From Eric) The ALA Committee on the Status of Women in Librarianship (COSWL) and the ALA-APA Standing Committee on the Salaries and Status of Library Workers (SSLW) will host a free webinar entitled Salary Equity and Library Workers: Experiences from the Field on How to Make it Happen on January 11, 2024, 1:00 2:30 pm (Central). Register now. Historically, women have been discriminated against in a variety of ways, a primary one being compensation. The ALA COSWL together with ALA-APA SSLW will highlight issues in this national situation through discussions of job evaluation studies and available resources.
