Ready Now: Supporting Youth and Families During Crisis Project

This project expands on the co-design work implemented in the summer of 2020 and led to the publication of [Library Staff as Public Servants: A Field Guide for Preparing to Serve Communities in Times of Crisis](#) (fondly known as The Field Guide), that outlines four Essential Tasks that libraries and their staff need to embrace to serve historically marginalized youth and families successfully.

Following the publication of the Field Guide, the project team recognized that many library staff would benefit from more training and resources for successful implementation of Field Guide principles. The **Ready Now: Supporting Youth and Families During Crisis** is delighted to receive funding from IMLS to further expand this work.

The project team is now recruiting teams across the United States to participate in a research study, the first phase of this work. Working with interested State Library agencies, they are seeking one team from states' that are interested in participating to apply. I am the designated person from the NJ State Library who will select an interested youth services front-line staff member who works with youth, and an administrator from their library, to be a part of the team. The project team will select 5 participating state teams from all the states' applications. **The deadline to apply is Nov. 21st.** If you are interested in knowing more about this project **check out the [FAQ](#) and the [pre-screening survey](#).**

The five teams invited to participate in the project will be required to dedicate between 2-3 hours per week over a 10-12-month timeframe, starting in 2024, and receive a **\$2000 payment made to their libraries.**

The Ready Now project team includes Dr. Mega Subramaniam (PI), a professor at the College of Information Studies at the University of Maryland; Linda Braun, a Consultant at LEO; and Nitzan Koren (co-PI), a PhD candidate at the College of Information Studies at the University of Maryland.

If you and an administrator (branch manager, department head, or member of leadership team) from your library might be interested in participating in this initiative, please let me know by Monday, November 20, 2023.

In partnership with Lyasis, NJSL rolled out a statewide virtual barcode for the Palace Project, providing access to eBooks and digital audiobooks for every New Jersey resident who chooses to sign up. This content includes the Digital Public Library of America-curated Palace Bookshelf of approximately 17,000 items, perpetually-licensed

Boundless (formerly Axis 360) titles in the New Jersey State Library's eRead New Jersey collection, and items purchased through the Palace Marketplace by the State Library. New Jersey residents can create a virtual barcode in the Palace app, with just an email address and authentication through geolocation (anywhere in NJ). Joann Sweetland Lum Literacy Grant Applications Being Accepted Until Dec. 1, 2023

Gregory Lum is a retired school librarian and former president of the Oregon Association of School Libraries. The YALSA Joann Sweetland Lum Literacy Grant was started four years ago to honor Gregory's late wife, and applications for this year's grant are due on December 1st.

If you have a literacy project in mind, you are encouraged to apply for the \$1,000 grant. Examples of literacy include, but are not limited to, digital, media, visual, computer, data, financial, civic/ethical, news, information, multicultural, and cultural. Applicants must work for and with youth (ages 10-19) in a library setting, which could be in a public, university, community college, school, or special library.

You do not need to be a member of YALSA to apply for the grant. However, if your grant is selected as the winning project, you must become a member. Grant funds can be used to cover the cost of YALSA membership. For more information:

Hands-On AI Literacy Programs for Youth and Teens Webinar



Ready to learn something new? Sign up for our November Webinar to learn more about an AI Literacy Program for both youth and teens!

Webinar Description:

In this YALSA webinar, Hee Rin Lee and Kahyun Choi will present an open-source AI literacy program that they developed through a grant from IMLS. The program provides youth with core knowledge about AI and its social consequences. It also encourages them to use their own unique strengths and resources to make a positive impact on their communities. Through participatory design methodologies, youth co-create AI solutions that address community challenges and envision how to use AI for their future jobs and local industries.

Speakers:

- Hee Rin Lee is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Media and Information at Michigan State University. Her research focuses on Human-Robot Interaction (HRI) and Human-Computer Interaction (HCI) to design and evaluate robots for social good. Her work has been recognized with a Best Paper Award and four Best Paper Nominations at respected HCI conferences, including CSCW, HRI, UbiComp, and CHI. Additionally, she has received funding from prestigious institutions such as the IMLS, NIH, and NSF to further her work.
- Kahyun Choi is an Assistant Professor in the Luddy School of Informatics, Computing, and Engineering at Indiana University Bloomington. Her research explores public library-based AI education programs, ethical AI for Libraries, Archives, and Museums (LAMs), music information retrieval, and computational analysis of lyrics and poetry. She has received the 2023 IU Trustees Teaching Award, the 2022 IMLS Early Career Research Development Project Grant, the 2021 IMLS National Leadership Grant, and the 2021 Luddy Faculty Fellowship.

Learning Outcomes:

- Learn how to teach core concepts of AI and its social implications to youth using open-source materials.
- Gain familiarity with strategies for engaging youth in co-creating AI solutions to address community challenges.
- Identify and address potential challenges in implementing the AI literacy program in your libraries.
- Get to know the insights and experiences of how our AI literacy program was implemented in three public libraries.
